 hundred and forty five and in the seventeenth year of  
 the reign of our sovereign lord George the second by  
 command of god of great Britain France and Ireland  
 being reformed of the faith William Swift a signed before  
 witnessed and declared by the said William Swift as and for

 his bond and note to me in consideration of money lost  
 by him by selling with my deceased Sons becoming and  
 dying insolvent and further I forgive him and Edward  
 Dolly the two and twenty pound ten shillings which he owes  
 me for two years rent of my tythes of Clark farm due  
 at Christmas last and I give him my mortgage upon  
 John Cane's Cotton Close for nine and twenty pound and  
 interest and I give him my eight day clock and I desire  
 my Executor to be further bind to him if the debts held  
 without charge I give to my daughter Jane wedding my  
 mortgage for eight and fifty pounds and interest upon the  
 estate of Elizabeth Buile of Girtford in the Parish of Sandy  
 living and being in Little Paxton aforesaid and I give her my  
 arm cane chair and cushion Item I give to Dorothy Smith  
 my daughter in law twenty pounds and all my weareing  
 apparel to help her to bring up and put out to trades her  
 children by the aforesaid William Smith her late husband  
 Item I give to every lawfull grandchild and great grandchild  
 that I shall have at the time of my death ten shillings to  
 buy them a good Bible and Common Prayer Book Item I  
 give to my aforesaid son James Smith all my personal Estate  
 with all my goods and chattels and credit whatsoever after  
 all my just debts and funeral charges and legacies aforesaid  
 are paid whom I also hereby make Constitute and appoint  
 to be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking  
 all former Wills by me made witness whereof I have thereto  
 set my hand and seal and published and declared  
 this to be my last Will and Testament the day and year first  
 above written being all written with my own hand  
 signed sealed and published to be the last Will and Testament
