 no force any thing hereon about mentioned to the contrary in any wise not
 withstanding. Item lastly I ordeyne and appoynte my wellbelovyd friends
 Giles Browner with Francis Arden Thomas Wood and Griffin Sherock
 to be Supervisors or Overseers of this my last will and Testament: whom
 I earnestly intreat and desire that upon any debate variance and contri-
 versie that hereafter should happen to be and arise betwene my said
 wife and my said Executor touching this my present will or the legacies
 thereby bequeathed or touching any part thereof, that they the said overseers
 or any two of them doe heere, end, and determine the same in equitie as
 they see cause without any suite of lawe: And what they or any two of them
 in default of the rest shall doe and order betwene them in and about the
 premises, I doe hereby stablish and approve the same to be my will and a
 pleasure, for whose payme by oversoming: and furthermore in the execution of
 the same my last will, I give leave, and bequeathe the somme of eight
 poundes of lawfull english money to be equally divided amongst them. In

payd my funerall expences discharged I give will and bequeath to Tho-
mas Belley my sonne whom I make constitute and ordayne sole Executor

poundes. Item to John Banks his children I give twenty shillings.
Item I give to Bridget certain stuff which I have of him in my keeping
