the xxijth day of July 1622 John Kinge of great Wardon in the County of Northampton beinge sick and weak in bodie but yet of good and perfect mind and remembrance to god heerefore doe make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge first I commend my soule into the hande of almighty god hopinge to be saved by the merittes death and passion of Jesus Christ and to be made partaker of the life everlastinge and my bodie to the earth from whence it came to be buried wth my exequies shall thynke meete and ad for my worldly goodes I dispose of them as followeth Inprimis I give and bequeathe unto Elizabeth Kinge Helen Kinge Anne Kinge and Mary Kinge my daughter to every one of them severally and to them jointly a pte of lawfull english money to be payd unto them at their severall ages of tigh teen yeares and if it shall happen any of my said four daughters to departe this world before they shall arrivge to their severall ages of eighteene yeares then my will and meaninge is that her or their parts so dyngge shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my survivinge Item I give and bequeathe unto Elizabeth Kinge my daughter my house called hoffer and the bullocke that was dones to me by you unto Helen my daughter that bullocke wch I bought of Wm. of Oxford Item I give and bequeathe unto every one of my four daughters thier severall apertes and my will and meaninge is that my exequies shall be done wch a bullocke for many my daughter the next yeare after my decease Item I give and bequeathe unto William Kinge and John Kinge the two somes of my brother Abraham Kinge to every one of them two of my best lambs a pte that be in Dotten Item I give and bequeathe unto every one of my god children an ewe lamb Item my will and meaninge is that my exequies shall paye the fines for my some William for the Dorepold lands at her charges also my will and meaninge is that the bedstead in the parlor the longe table in the hall and the forme the Dubboird in the hall and the glasses shall stande in the house and remaine to the heire of William my some also the dore and the pte in the kitchen to be sold for William my some Item I give and bequeathe unto
