 ten pounde a piece of lawfull english money to be payd unto them at their
 severall ages of tigh teen yeares and if it shall happen any of my saide four
 daughters to departe this world before they shall attaine their
 severall ages of eighteene yeares then my will and meaninge is that her
 or their parts severally shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my
 survivors Item I give and bequeathe unto Elizabeth Kinge my daughter
 my house called hoffer and the blacke bullocke that was dones to me
 I give unto Helen my daughter that bullocke with the boughten of Wingham of
 Oxford Item I give and bequeathe unto every one of my four daughters
 their severall apertes and my will and meaninge is that my executor shall
 provide for a bullocke for every my daughter the next yeare after my de-
 cease Item I give and bequeathe unto William Kinge and John Kinge the
 two sonnes of my brother Abraham Kinge to every one of them two of my best
 lambe a part that be in Dotten Item I give and bequeathe unto every
 one of my god children an ewe lambe Item my will and meaninge is that
 my executor shall pay the fines for my some William for the Dorepold
 lands at her charges also my will and meaninge is that the bedstead in
 the parlor the longe table in the hall and the forme the Dubboard in the
 hall and the glasses shall be stonde in the house and remaine to the
