The fourteenth day of July in the year of our Lord God according to the  
Computation of the Church of England One thousand six hundred and fiftie

therefore Do make and ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner  
and forme following: In primis I command my Sonnes into the hands of

of God in Christ Jesus And my bodie to the Earth to bee buried where my  
coator shall appointe in the church yarde of Great Paxton Item I give  
and bequeath unto my Sonson William Younge the elder of Offord Parke  
in the said County of Huntingdon Gentleman That bond and debt of £ one  
pound and six pence shillings owing unto me by the said William Younge  
and due to me at Michaelmas next Item I give and bequeath unto my  
sister Thomas Bolton the elder Roger Bolton and William Bolton his  
Brother and to every of them Twentie shillings a pece to bee paid unto  
them immediately after my decease Item I give and bequeath unto my  
Sonson William Boltons children Three pounds a pece to bee paid  
unto them as they shall attayne unto their severall ages of one and twentie  
yeares. Item I give and bequeath unto my Sonson and Godson Thomas  
Younge Five pounds to bee paid unto him immediately after my decease.  
Item I give unto my Sonson Charles Younge John Younge and Humphrey  
Younge Sonnes of the said William Younge A dozen pounds apiece to bee  
paid to them at their severall ages of one and twentie years. Item I give  
and bequeath unto my Sonson Margaret Lane The summe of Twelve pounds  
to bee paid unto her immediately after my decease. Item I give and bequeath  
unto my Sonson Roger Bolton Daugther Elizabeth flower pounds to bee  
paid at her age of one and twentie years. Item I give unto my Sonson  
Samuell Harris his children first To his eldest Sonne named Samuell  
Harris Sixpence pounds to bee paid unto him immediately after my decease  
And to Thomas Harris and Jindah Harris Eight pounds a pece to bee  
paid unto them at their severall ages of one and twentie years. Item I give  
unto my Sonson Christopher Fisher Eight pounds And unto Thomas  
Fisher and Elizabeth their Liffers Sixpence pounds a pece to bee paid unto  
them at their severall ages of one and twentie years. Item I give unto  
my Sonson and Godson Gilbert Hause Ten pounds to bee paid unto  
him immediately after my decease Item I give unto my Sonson John Hause

John Hams and Mathew Hams his sonne a poore to bee paid unto  
 them at their laburall aged of one and twenty yeares Item I give unto  
 Marie Hams and Sarah Hams by her sonnde a poore to bee paid unto  
 them at their laburall aged of one and twenty yeares Item I give unto  
 Richard Lont the summe of fyve pounds to bee paid unto him at his  
 age of one and twenty yeares Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth  
 Ringe of Great Paxton widdow the summe of sixe pounds to bee paid  
 unto her immediately after my decesse Item I give and bequeath unto  
 John Ringe of Huntingdon Woollen Draper the summe of fifteen  
 pounds to bee paid unto him immediately after my decesse Item I give  
 unto the poore of Great Paxton the summe of fforre and fourtie shillings  
 to bee dispayled at the discretion of my sonson William Hams And all  
 the rest of my worldly goodes and chattellis moveable and unmoveable —  
 hysse and her holdes land meadowe and pasture I give and bequeath unto  
 my sonson Thomas Hams of Bulden in the said County of Huntingdon  
 Yoman And to his heires and Aliigned for ever whom I doe make and  
 ordayne sole Exeutor of this my last will and Testament And I doe  
 nomynate and appointe the aforesaid John Ringe to bee overseer of this  
 my will That is to saye difference shall or may hereafter arise about my  
 will The said John Ringe shall gibe the sume, meainghe and interpretation  
 therof And if any one before mymynated in this my will shall refuse to  
 abide byt his interpretation as aforesaid That then my will is That heo  
 shes or they see refusinge shall losse the benefitt of this my will And the  
 legacie herin to him her or them giben: And whereas I have given by  
 Enuident certaine Coppie holdes lande holden of the Mannes of Great  
 Paxton to my sonson Willam Hams fforendred unto me by John —  
 Northdeaton the elder and John Northdeaton the younger My will is that  
 is at and tyme hereafter the said lande shall bee redeemed (they bothe  
 but conditionally fforendred) That then my said sonson Willam Hams  
 shall haue the whole summe of money that shall bee paid for the  
 Redemption of the said Coppy holdes lande In witness whereof I  
 haue hereunto sett my hand and Seale the day and yere abovesaid y  
 me Gilburtum Longe Published and declared to bee my last will and  
 Testament in the presence of And the wande John Vininge and the  
 wande and Aliigned were entyned before the sealinge hereof Richard
