In witness & committ my soule into the hands of god my creator trusting by the mercies and pesson of my blessed lord and saviour Jesu Christ to be a saved and my body to be decently buried by mine executors And concerning that worldly estate which hath pleased god to bless me with I desyred it in manner and forme following that Item to give and bequeath to my brothe Mr John Henson some pounds to be paid him within halfe a year after my decease Item to give and bequeath unto my sister Anne Doreden some pounds to be paid within six moneths after my decease Item to give and bequeath unto my brother Edward Henson twenty pounds within a year after my decease Item to give and bequeath unto my sonne Edward Henson and his daughter Grace Clarke five pounds to be paid within halfe a year after my decease Item to give unto the poore people of Great Paxton five pounds for a doownd stocke and the interest to be paid amongst them the thirtie first day of March every year Item to give and bequeath unto Mathew Weston & my brothe Mr John Henson his sonnes land and forty pounds to be paid him after his death his fatheres and mothes debts and the interest to his father and mothe & his executors deriving there and yelde of their navelle lived & givne to his daughters Sibylle Shelling & Item to give to Thomas Kings childrens doole shilling to be paid them within a year after my decease Item to give to Mathew Doreden my best footbed and a pair of sheets and a bolster and pillow; and all other my household stuffe to be equally devided with my brother between my brother Mr John Henson and sister Anne Doreden except one booke called Maldonatus upon this Evangelist whiche giveth me living friends William Vane of Offord daie Item to give to Bartholomew Doreden my sonne Item doo to shillings and appointe William Vane of Offord daie gentleman Richard Allen of great Paxton gentleman Obidiah Soyle of Epen gentleman and Albian Chrogrammon of Offord Slary gentleman successours of this my last will and testament and doe give to either of them for to pay shillings a pece to buy yelde of them a ring And all the rest of my goods and money by debt and legacie deftueyed I give unto whom I make sole executor of this my last will and testament except my neareing which I give to my brother John Henson and my sister Anne Doreden And to defre sturt pounds to be payed at bimale by testimonie whiche I have written in this hand and sealed this present third day of September 1659 Mathew Weston Subscribyed Sealed in the presence of William Vane publicke notary.

A Codicil Nullcupatur to be added to this last will and testament in writing of Mathew Weston late of Great Paxton in the County of Huntington deceased bearing date the third day of September in the year of our Lord 1659 before witness

Memorandum. That the said Mathew Weston deceased having made his will in writing and therin left a sume for the nomination of his executors and successours named after the substance of the said will declare that Mr Albian Chrogrammon and Mr Obidiah Soyle should be his executors and more especially

on a. a. b. c. the eighth day of November in the year of our Lord 1662 be-
ing of perfect age and memory, with a serious resolution to give
to his said said will declare that he hath made his will in writing at Chipping-
Cn. That the same was in the hands of Mr. Albion Chipping or son. And that in
the same there was a blank left for the nomination of executors therin.
And therefore he did declare that the said Albion Chipping or son, and one
Obidiah Chyngh should be executors of his said will and that the said
will should stand. And that the nomination of the said executors together
with the said will should remain and be his full and entire will and
